Fun Fall Activities

Fall brings with it a ton of fun ideas for you and your children to enjoy together at home: **Leaf rubbings with peeled crayons, hammer golf tees into a large pumpkin (they will LOVE this), read as many fall-themed books as possible, visit Robinettes or Koetsiers and go on a hayride, carve a pumpkin & have your child sort the goop from the seeds, collect acorns and use them for counting practice, make patterns with red and yellow leaves, use tweezers on dried corn to pick out kernels (great fine motor skill!) and so much more!! ☺ Enjoy what we can before the snow flies!

Some Ideas for Home...

Your child has started to practice writing his/her name with us this month in the classroom. We will have a sample of this taken from each month so that we can show you the progress (s)he has made at conferences in November and March. Please keep in mind that each child develops certain skills at different times than others, and if this is an area where you see your little one becoming frustrated or refusing to try, here are some fun ideas to encourage further practice: use shaving cream on a cookie sheet... writing letters with a capped pen or a finger in this is great fun! Pour salt on a colored plate, same idea and also a ton of fun. You can write your child's name first and then ask him/her to trace over it in a different color. Using wiki stix (little wax strips) is a fun way to form letters as well. With all of us working together, this skill will be mastered in no time at all! Thanks for your help and encouragement!!

Monthly Character Trait

Every month at Mayflower a character trait is introduced and focused on throughout daily instruction and routines. During the month of October we will be talking about **SHARING**. We will learn how, and why, we should share with our friends and siblings. We will acknowledge that sharing is indeed hard, but rewarding at the same time when done well. We will be acting out some sharing situations and then have the kids evaluate each scenario. We hope, but won't promise, to graduate your child to a "Master Sharer" in just 4 short weeks! ☺ At home when a good "sharing situation" arises, talk it out with your child explaining to him/her why sharing is important and praise any wonderful sharing behavior that you observe!

1. Donations of creative "junk" (seasonal or not) are truly appreciated; our students seem to go through our junk stash every week!
2. It is getting colder... coats, mittens and even hats are great ideas for morning outdoor play!
